

Surgical Treatment. The operations recognized by most surgeons include: Roux-en-Y gastric bypass, gastric banding (adjustable or non-adjustable), sleeve gastrectomy, malabsorption procedures (biliopancreatic diversion, duodenal switch) and vertical banded gastroplasty. Occasionally, surgical revision is the only solution. Vertical banded gastroplasty, open and laparoscopic, has produced good results for both weight loss and comorbidity, but comparable or better results are achieved with either adjustable gastric banding or gastric bypass.
